3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Ensuring Economic5 Recovery Act".

SEC. 2. SMALL BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION REPORTS ON
SMALL BUSINESS RECOVERY AND THE IM PACT OF AN HOURLY FEDERAL MINIMUM
WAGE INCREASE.

5 (a) INITIAL REPORT.—Not later than 180 days after the date of the enactment of this Act, the Administrator 6 7 of the Small Business Administration shall submit to the Committee on Small Business of the House of Representa-8 tives and the Committee on Small Business and Entrepre-9 neurship of the Senate a report on the recovery of small 10 business concerns (as defined under section 3 of the Small 11 Business Act (15 U.S.C. 632)) from the coronavirus pan-12 13 demic, including the effects of an increase in the Federal 14 minimum hourly wage to \$15—

15 (1) disaggregated by industry; and

16 (2) on such concerns that have less than 50017 employees.

18 (b) SUBSEQUENT REPORT.—Not later than 180 days 19 after the date on which a law is enacted that proposes 20 increasing the Federal minimum hourly wage to \$15 or 21 greater, the Administrator of the Small Business Adminis-22 tration shall submit to the Committee on Small Business of the House of Representatives and the Committee on 23 24 Small Business and Entrepreneurship of the Senate a 25 study on the effect of such an increase on small business 3

concerns as compared to small business concerns that pay 1 2 the current minimum wage. Such report shall include— 3 (1) an analysis of the net effect on prices, or 4 costs of goods or services, provided by such con-5 cerns, disaggregated by industry; 6 (2) a description of the change in levels of em-7 ployment and work hours, including any changes in 8 the age of employees and in the number of part-time employees; 9 10 (3) the total number of job losses associated with the increase to the Federal minimum hourly 11 wage, as reported by such concerns; and 12 13 (4) an analysis of any increase in automation 14 associated with such increase.
